SUSAN STOUT will be celebrating her retirement after a remarkable 19-year tenure at the Hillsdale County Community Foundation, where her "job" turned into a career.

Since 2005, Stout has been impacting our community through her work on various community initiatives. Susan spearheaded the Hillsdale County Warm the Children program that provides essential winter clothing for children in our county. She has initiated various educational programs, including the Hillsdale County College Fair, and managed the scholarship program



from 2005 to 2021. Her oversight of numerous grant programs, such as Healthy Senior Healthy Youth, Love Your Community, and the library grant program, continues to enrich the lives of the people living in Hillsdale County. In 2024, she received the "Friend of Education" award from the Gamma Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society of Key Women Educators, recognizing her program development and leadership. According to Stout, "I have had the privilege to know both givers of money and the receivers of the services and I appreciate the heart of them all. I hope I have made an impact in a few of the lives of those I have met along the way."

IRA Giving


The Hillsdale County Community Foundation provides a range of giving options designed to suit the unique needs of our community members. For individuals over the age of 70 ½ years, one of the best options for saving on taxes is making a gift from an IRA through a gualified charitable distribution (QCD). Donors over 73 years of age can even have their gift count towards their required minimum distribution (RMD) that would otherwise be taxable income. This giving option helps ensure that your IRA funds can support your local community without giving up control through potentially heavy taxes. Love Your Community Grant Awards

This year, the Grant Committee selected several Love Your Community projects, which were subsequently approved by the HCCF Board of Trustees. The Love Your Community initiative was developed to support projects and programs aimed at enhancing and engaging communities. Eligible projects include community beautification efforts and initiatives that promote community improvement, interaction, or engagement. This program aims to foster a stronger, more vibrant community through innovative and impactful projects.

The following 2024 projects were approved:

- \$3,700.00 was awarded to the Village of North Adams for ballpark improvements. The village plans to pour a concrete slab under the bleachers at the local ballpark.
- \$3,900.00 was awarded to Hillsdale County to make roof repairs to the pavilions at Lewis Emery Park.


