

To begin, you'll first determine the purpose of your fund and the kind of impact you hope to achieve. Next, decide on the financial commitment you're prepared to make.



Hillsdale College GOAL Program

Many Futures Empowered:

Over the past several years, the Hillsdale County Community Foundation has partnered with the Hillsdale College GOAL Program to create a meaningful impact throughout our community. Through this collaboration, the Foundation has funded a variety of initiatives that serve a wide range of populations across Hillsdale County.

From walking dogs at the Humane Society, offering companionship to widows, or spending time with residents at the Medical Care Facility, the GOAL Program is designed to foster connection, compassion, and service throughout the county.

The Foundation provided \$25,345 in funding for 19 volunteer programs. This support enabled more than 341 events that directly impacted over 2,215 individuals, and indirectly reached many more. Additionally, over 1,000 volunteers generously contributed more than 21,124 hours of service, further strengthening our community.

The GOAL Program is a vital part of Hillsdale County, and we are proud to provide the necessary funding for these initiatives.

Grant Camps

Every child deserves the chance to experience the joy and growth that camp provides. Thanks to a generous \$5,200 grant from the Kellogg Youth Advisory Fund, this vision became a reality. Funding supported Hospice's Camp Courage for grief support and gave children in foster care the opportunity to attend a variety of camp sessions at Kimball Camp. Camp offers a unique space where kids can connect, have fun, and grow in meaningful ways. In these moments they rise above challenges, build confidence, and begin to dream of a brighter future.

Scholarship Camps

Summer camps supported by scholarships, provide meaningful opportunities for young people to gain knowledge and build valuable skills. This year, HCCF awarded \$4,735 in scholarships through four generous funds, enabling 25 students to attend three specialized camps: Boudro Wrestling Camp, Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, and the Hillsdale Strings Festival. Thanks to the support of the Frank & Angel Beck Memorial Wrestling Award, Sandy Klingler Memorial Music Scholarship, Sara & Dale Harmelink Fund, and the Lint Family Music Fund, these young participants were able to grow not only in their craft but also in communication, confidence, and leadership. The experience was truly transformative for each of them.

Creating Waves of Empowerment

Salem Church Generator



Salem Church, a designated Red Cross Emergency Disaster Relief Shelter, serves the community in many vital ways: hosting blood drives, supporting displaced families, and acting as a pillar of local support. To support these efforts for years to come, the church was awarded a \$35,000 grant for a generator. This addition ensures their services can continue uninterrupted during power outages, offering peace of mind and a reliable refuge for those in need.

Lewis Emery Park



The ponds at Lewis Emery Park play a vital role in our community, where children learn to fish and families enjoy the outdoors together. To preserve this treasured resource, a \$6,500 grant was awarded to help manage invasive aquatic species and provide a solar powered portable aeration unit. These efforts will help maintain ecological balance, support a healthy aquatic ecosystem, and ensure the ponds remain a valuable site for recreational fishing.

Ground Penetrating Radar

Preserving local history relies on maintaining accurate records of cemeteries and other historic sites. To support this effort, the City of Hillsdale was awarded a \$24,545 grant to purchase a Ground Penetrating Radar system. This advanced technology enables precise analysis of cemetery grounds, helping to accurately locate burial plots and ensure responsible, efficient use of space. This initiative represents a forward-thinking approach to preservation, ensuring best practices are followed in the stewardship of these historic areas.

Hillsdale County Food Initiatives

Fighting food insecurity remains a critical initiative throughout Hillsdale County. Thanks to the support of three generous funds: the Community Investment Fund, the V.C. and Velma Knight Memorial Fund, and the Mary Alice Powers Pope Fund, \$60,000 was distributed to:

- Camden United Methodist Church Food Pantry
- Current Church Food Pantry
- First Church of Christ Food Pantry—Waldron
- Hillsdale County Senior Services Center
- King's Kupboard
- Litchfield Rotary Club
- St. Anthony's Catholic Church Family Center
- The Salvation Army

These funds helped stock pantry shelves with essential items to support individuals and families facing difficult times.

In addition, our Y.O.U.T.H. Advisory Council hosted a "Fill-the-Freezer" event, donating \$15,000 worth of goods including paper products, hygiene items, canned foods, pantry staples, cleaning supplies, and meat. This event provided food pantries and a local shelter with much-needed items that fall outside of their regular budgets.

Prepared to Save & Ready to Build

Reading Emergency Unit

Emergency response units are a vital part of our community, and to help them perform at their best, the Reading Emergency Unit was awarded a \$5,000 grant from the V.C. and Velma Knight Memorial Fund for Intraosseous (I/O) Kits. These specialized kits enable medical personnel to establish vascular access through a patient's bone marrow when traditional intravenous (IV) access is difficult or impossible.

With these kits, responders can gain immediate access to the circulatory system during critical or life-threatening situations, enhancing the level of care they provide. These kits are vital to our communities' wellbeing, helping ensure that timely, high-quality healthcare remains accessible.

Robotics Grant

With the support of a \$10,000 grant from the Kellogg Youth Advisory Fund, the Hillsdale Robotics team (HEROES) were able to upgrade their robotics workshop with new equipment and added workstations. These enhancements have improved safety, boosted functionality, and created more opportunities for collaboration with robotics teams from other school districts.

Located at Hillsdale High School, the upgraded space serves as a central hub where students can connect, exchange ideas, and develop their robotics skills together. This shared workshop is the beginning of new relationships across district lines that will benefit students county-wide.

Each year a list is collected of children in need and they are able to purchase winter items such as boots, gloves, hats, snowpants, and coats. Since its inception in 2007 over \$144,000 has been spent to clothe approximately 2,444 children. A child should never have to worry about being warm enough and this program ensures these children always have warm winter clothing.



Adeline Godfrey-Dilley Memorial Scholarship – a scholarship to a Camden-Frontier School graduating senior.

Deputy Bill Butler Law Enforcement Legacy Fund – a field of interest fund that provides support to local law enforcement personnel to attend any accredited police academy.

Charles and Sonya Moore Family Community Support Fund – a donor advised fund that provides financial support to special projects and organizations that support the residents of Hillsdale County.

Edward L. Kunesh Youth Agricultural Education Fund – a field of interest fund that provides financial support to 4-H programming in Hillsdale County and assistance to local FFA students to attend state and national conventions.
