Y.O.U.T.H. Fill-the-Freezer

On Wednesday, July 23, the Hillsdale County Community Foundation Youth Advisory Committee, Y.O.U.T.H. (Youth Opportunities Unlimited Throughout Hillsdale), hosted its annual “Fill the Freezer” event to help combat food insecurity. The event aims to support local food pantries by providing \$15,000 in donations.

A fan favorite among our Y.O.U.T.H. members, this annual food drive offers them a chance to make a tangible difference in the lives of people right here in Hillsdale County. This year, we were proud to sponsor five food pantries and one shelter: Current Church Food Pantry, King's Kupboard Food Pantry, Salvation Army, St. Anthony Catholic Church Family Center, Waldron First Church of Christ Food Pantry, and Domestic Harmony.

Each organization received a wide variety of items, including canned foods, grocery staples, meat, paper goods, hygiene products, and cleaning supplies.

Our goal during this event is to provide these pantries and the shelter with items they may not always receive or have difficulty obtaining, especially meat and other nutritious foods, which are often in short supply. At “Fill the Freezer,” we make it a priority to ensure each organization receives its own supply of meat and specific items they request based on the needs of the people they serve.

Edward L. Kunesh Fund Impact

Thanks to the Edward L. Kunesh Youth Agricultural Education Fund, we were able to support students from Camden-Frontier, Jonesville, and Waldron Area Schools in attending the FFA State Convention. This grant opportunity allowed 53 students to participate and compete in a variety of events. Each school performed exceptionally well, with several students placing at the state level and some advancing to the FFA National Convention.

Additionally, through the National Convention Grant, 13 students will be attending the FFA National Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. During this three-day event, students will engage in networking, competition, and learning opportunities alongside FFA teams from across the country. This experience offers a unique chance for students to expand their knowledge and develop valuable skills in agriculture and leadership.

The Foundation is also pleased to offer the Edward L. Kunesh Young Farmer Support Grant, which opens on October 1, 2025, and closes on November 15, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. This grant is designed to support young farmers by providing funding for equipment, livestock, infrastructure, or crops. Available to young farmers aged 18-36.

Donating from your IRA is a smart and efficient way to give back to your community while potentially reducing your tax burden. Here's what you can achieve with a charitable gift from your IRA:

Taking a regular distribution from your IRA may increase your taxable income. However, making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows you to donate directly to a qualified nonprofit, like the Hillsdale County Community Foundation, without incurring taxes on the amount gifted.

IRA Charitable Giving Benefits:

- Starting at age 70 ½, you can make tax-free gifts up to \$108,000 per year directly from your IRA
- At age 73 or older, your charitable gift can count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Getting started is simple, just contact your IRA administrator to request a qualified charitable distribution.

Love Your Community Grant Awards—\$9,331.00

Hillsdale County Community Foundation is proud to announce the recipients of this year's Love Your Community awards. These grants support projects that strengthen connections and enhance quality of life throughout Hillsdale County.
